INTRODUCTION

- World Tuberculosis (TB) Day is commemorated annually on the 24th of March across the globe in recognition of the date, in 1882, when Dr Robert Koch announced his discovery of Mycobacterium tuberculosis, the bacillus that causes tuberculosis.
- The United Nations agencies and global community began commemorating World TB Day in 1982 in recognition of the increase in TB infections and the ravaging effects of the disease
- South Africa began commemorating World TB Day in 1996 after the formation of the National TB Control Programme.
- Global themes for World TB Day are determined annually by the World Health Organisation (WHO) in line with the priorities at the time
- Global themes are permeated with the country's particular circumstances to ensure relevance and focus
- SAMI is guided by both hence our current theme: "the clock is ticking...defeat TB
 ...now and forever in SAMI.."








INTRODUCTION

- The global theme for 2021 World TB Day was retained "It's Time", as it was in 2020.
- Similarly, and in line with the drive to end TB as a public health threat by the year 2030 (Sustainable Development Goals),
 - South Africa retained the national theme: "Cheka Impilo: It's time to end TB"
- The goal of South Africa's 2021 campaign is that leaders, particularly all healthcare workers as well as parliamentarians and legislators, lead the efforts of rapidly finding missing TB patients with the thrust to:
 - increase awareness of TB among leaders; and
 - mobilise leaders to lead efforts to end TB.









2014 TB Milestones

Reduction and Prevention of TB

By December 2024, the TB incidence rate should be at or below the National TB incident rate.

Reduction and Prevention of HIV and AIDS

100% of employees should be offered HIV Counselling and Testing (HCT) annually with all eligible employees linked to an Antiretroviral Therapy Treatment (ART) Programme as per the National Strategic Plan (NSP).








Trends of DMRE 164 Submissions










