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

What we Know About Masoyise...!

- The Masoyise Health Programme is implemented in a space with legislative and policy frameworks (e.g. C176, C190, R200 and National Laws...)
- DMRE with other Government Departments and Agencies remain key in the implementation and successes of Masoyise.
- Organized Business (host of the programme) and Organized Labour contribute to the success of the programme.
- The technical support from the United Nations in South Africa, particularly ILO, WHO and UNAIDS bring additional value to Masoyise.
- Various Mining Companies and their employees that equally implement and beneficiaries of the Programme are significant stakeholders.

The Work of Masoyise Health Programme...

- The Masoyise Health Programme implemented, observed and recorded several successes, and equally noted some challenges.
- Based on these observations and realizations, Masoyise stakeholders have considered to engage other stakeholders beyond the mining industry in order to share these experiences, and perhaps learn from others in order to overcome some of the recurring challenges.
- The purpose of such an initiative will be to share the experiences, including both successes and challenges of the Masoyise Health Programme with other sectors/industries beyond Mining.
- In addition, to facilitate an exchange of experiences from other sectors (non-mining) who have implemented similar response strategies related to HIV, TB and Non-Communicable Diseases (NCDs).

Other Sectors/Industries in the SA Economy...

STATS SA classifies, collect and report data from **9-Industries** incl. Agriculture, **Mining (413,000)**, Manufacturing, Utilities, Construction, Trade, Transport, Finance, Private Households, Community and Social Services.

- Agriculture : Characterised by Seasonal Workers and Mobility employs almost 888,000 workers;
- Construction: Characterised by labour intensive activities, seasonal workers and mobility employs approximately 1,201,000 people;
- Finance : A sector dominated by young professionals with a total workforce of about 2,667,000 employees; and/or
- **Transport** : High-levels of mobility with workers away from home (Truck-Drivers) who are predominantly men, employs about **992,000** workers.

Sharing Masoyise with Other Sectors/Industries

In conclusion, the strategy is to Share; Learn; Apply; and Assist.

Masoyise Health Programme and its stakeholders will **share** their experiences; **learn** from others; **apply** lessons for further improvement of the Masoyise Health Programme; and **assist** other sectors where required and possible.
