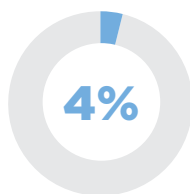


The number of fatalities in the South African mining industry improved by 34% to 49 in 2022, compared to 74 in 2021.

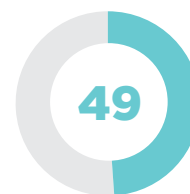

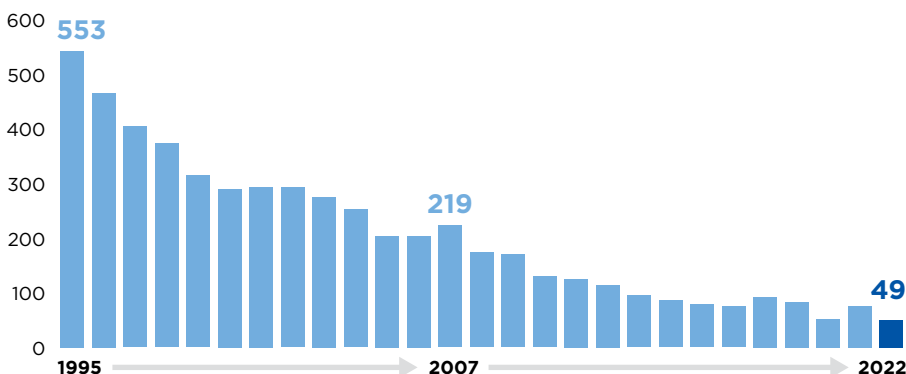
OVERVIEW OF PERFORMANCE 2022

There was a significant reduction in fatalities in 2022 to a record low of 49 after a concerted effort by all mining industry stakeholders and strict focus on the safety strategies developed to improve working conditions. This is a 34% improvement on the 74 fatalities in 2021.

Transport and mining-related accidents, of which there were 17, were the cause of the largest number of fatalities. "General" accidents were the next highest contributor to overall fatalities with 16 fatalities recorded in 2022. Fall of ground-related accidents were reduced by 73% to six in 2022.

The industry also reported a total of 2,056 serious injuries in 2022, down from 2,143 in 2021.
