## MINERALS COUNCIL SUPPORTS EFFORTS TO ERADICATE GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE AND FEMICIDE

**Johannesburg, 4 February 2021**: The Minerals Council South Africa today attended the fundraising event hosted by President Cyril Ramaphosa to secure the active participation and financial investment of the private and philanthropic sectors to address gender-based violence and femicide (GBVF) in South Africa.

In representing the Minerals Council, Nolitha Fakude, Vice President and Chair of the Women in Mining Forum pledged the mining industry's support for the GBVF Response Fund, noting that it will complement what many member companies are already doing.

"Last year we launched our Stop Abuse of Women initiative, building on the extensive work already undertaken under the banner of women in mining.
