**Dr Pride Chigwedere, MD, PhD**

Dr Pride Chigwedere is the Senior Policy and Strategy Advisor in the Joint United Nations Programme on HIV/AIDS (UNAIDS) South Africa country office. He is a global health expert who has experiences that range from clinical medicine and research, through to public health policy and management strategy, and political and multilateral negotiations.

He trained in medicine at the University of Zimbabwe followed by specialized training in Immunology and infectious diseases at the Harvard AIDS Initiative while studying for a PhD. He then worked for McKinsey and Company in New York, serving on the leading global pharmaceutical and medical products corporations, before moving to UNAIDS.

With UNAIDS, Dr Chigwedere began as Coordinator for Universal Access for the Eastern and Southern Africa Region, moved to become Senior Advisor to the African Union, then Senior Policy and Strategy Advisor for UNAIDS China, and now Senior Policy and Strategy Advisor for South Africa.
